Our Storytelling program provides an opportunity to create and present an original oral narrative that brings their image of the future to life. The real world issues we use engage and inspire learning.



How Storytelling works



Grades 4-12

Storytellers develop a creative, futuristic narrative to entertain and inform listeners. Students compete through schools, clubs. or independently in one of our three divisions: junior (4-6), middle (7-9), and senior (10-12).



Scenario performance

Students learn to thoroughly research a real world issue and make a prediction of the future set 20-30 years from now. Instead of writing out the story in full, students relate it in a live five minute performance, treating the future as if it were the present. Video may be used for virtual competitions.



Competition season

Performers compete as individuals. Many storytellers also participate in our Creative Writing and/or Global Issues programs. We invite all regional affiliate champions to attend our International Conference in June.
